PRESERVE TIBURON AND BELVEDERE OPEN SPACE

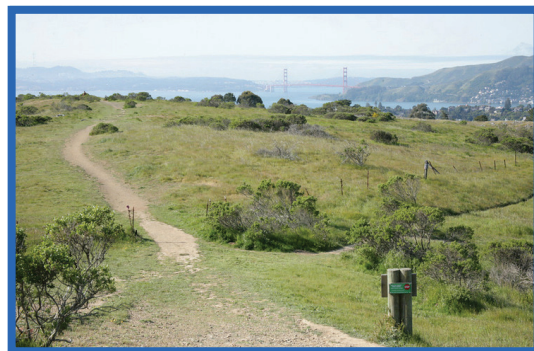
Vote YES on Measure M to protect open space, natural areas, wildlife habitat and water quality surrounding Tiburon and Belvedere.
